Transportation of Dangerous Goods

The transportation and shipment of hazardous materials and dangerous goods by any CBS employee or contractor without proper training and documentation is not permitted.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and Department of Transportation (DOT) govern the transportation and shipment of hazardous materials and dangerous goods.

Following are some common examples of dangerous goods which are unlawful to ship or transport without proper authority:

- 1. Aerosol containers of any kind, such as WD-40, hair spray, air spray, adhesives and paint.**
- 2. Flammable and combustible liquids, such as gasoline, diesel fuel, solvents and acetone.**
- 3. Lithium batteries, such as camera or laptop batteries.**
- 4. Paint or sludge hazardous waste or universal waste, such as light bulbs.**

These restrictions apply to shipping by carrier and also to items packed in your personal luggage. If you are in doubt, Do Not Ship!
